Preventive Health Plan Puppy

Underdeveloped Immune Systems

Puppies are very susceptible to diseases at this stage in their lives. It is important to vaccinate and bring in a minimum of two fecal samples for analysis to provide maximum protection.

Rapid Growth

Puppies grow at an accelerated rate. All breeds and sizes – especially giant breed dogs – need to be seen on a regular basis to make sure that they are growing at an acceptable rate. This will decrease the chance of developing musculoskeletal and other organ problems down the road.

Prevention

Preventive care is the foundation for providing your puppy a lifetime of good health. Many diseases can be successfully managed with early screening, including bloodwork and urine analysis. Early disease detection is key to preventing serious illness and expensive costs.
